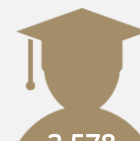

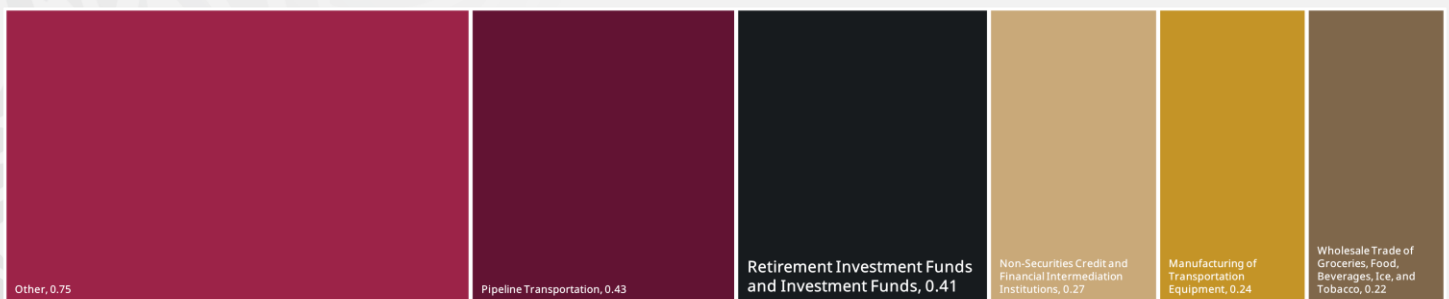
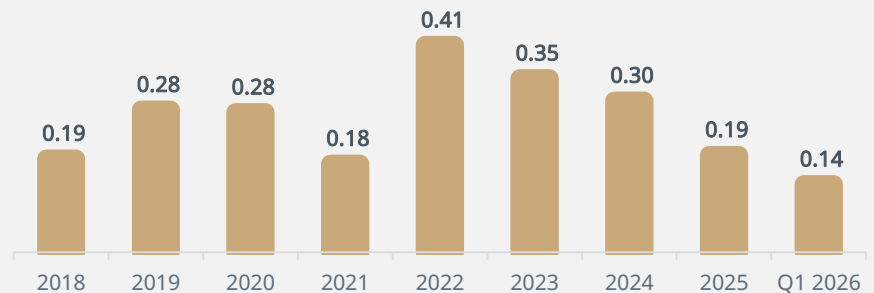
Historic FDI
