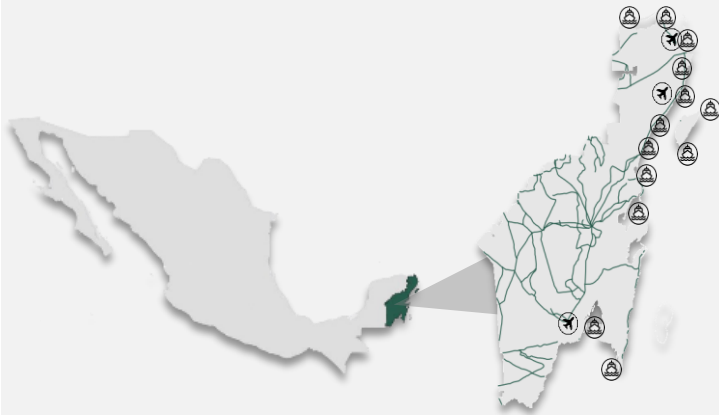

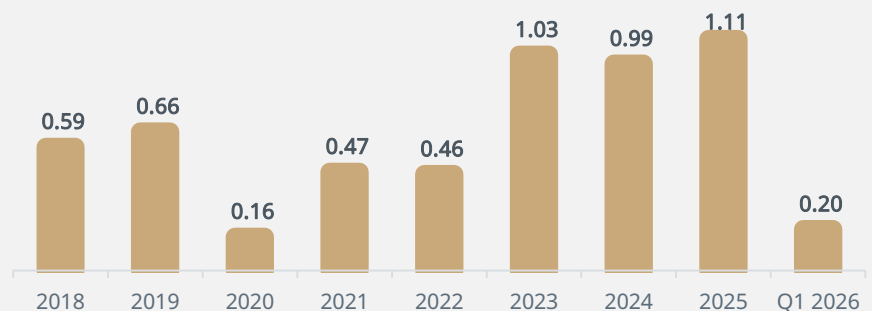
Historic FDI
