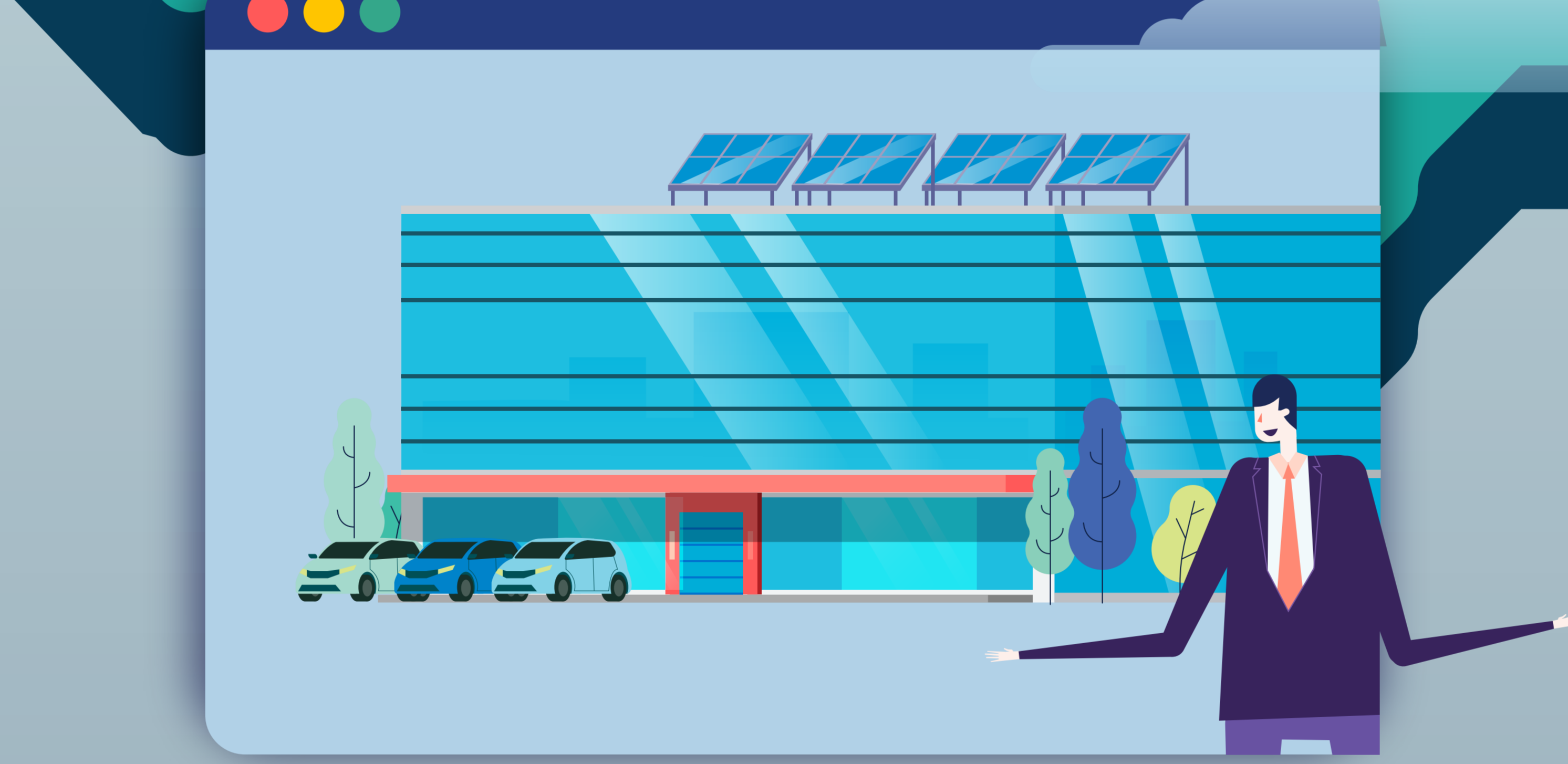
Jalisco by sea
