A Development Axis



Air Connectivity:

- Villahermosa International Airport (Carlos Rovirosa Pérez):
 Strategically located 16 km from the capital, the airport handles
 national passenger flights and dedicated cargo operations.
 - Strategic Routes: Offers 9 daily connections to Mexico City
 (CDMX) and links to Mexico's most vital cities.
- Rapid Business Connectivity: Key infrastructure for facilitating rapid supply chains and Just-in-Time (JIT) logistics operations.
- **Strategic Proximity:** Provides immediate access to key industrial and commercial hubs across Southeast Mexico.

Maritime Transport:

- **Port of Dos Bocas (Paraíso):** A pivotal logistics platform for the energy industry and international trade, featuring specialized terminals for bulk cargo and fossil fuels.
- Port of Frontera (Centla, APITAB): Operates in general commerce and fishing, with significant potential for expansion in cargo handling and operational capacity.
 - Port of Chiltepec (Paraíso, APITAB): Serves commercial and fishing activities, effectively strengthening the local maritime logistics network.
 - Port of Sánchez Magallanes (Cárdenas): Provides essential infrastructure support to the regional fishing economy.

A Development Axis



Road Transport:

- Federal Highway 180 (MEX 180): A critical artery connecting Tabasco with Veracruz, Ciudad del Carmen, Campeche, and the Yucatán Peninsula.
- Federal Highway 186 (MEX 186): Provides a seamless connection to Escárcega and the wider Southeast Corridor.
- State Infrastructure: A comprehensive network comprising 605 local roads, extending over 5,488 km (4,001 km of which are paved).
- Villahermosa Beltway (28 km): A crucial bypass that optimizes urban mobility and regional logistics by rerouting heavy commercial traffic around the capital.


Rail Transport:

- National Rail Integration: Over 320 km of railway lines integrated into the national freight system.
 - FA Line (Palenque-Coatzacoalcos): Offers a direct, strategic link with the Tren Maya (Maya Train) and the Interoceanic Corridor of the Isthmus of Tehuantepec (CIIT).
 - Dedicated Right-of-Way: The Chontalpa Station Dos Bocas route spans 94 km, providing reinforced connectivity to the key port facility.

Municipalities

Abundant Groundwater Availability: Tabasco benefits from extensive groundwater resources, particularly across its low-lying, flat terrain, ensuring supply for industrial use.

Reliable Electric Infrastructure: The state is robustly equipped with an extensive network of substations and transmission lines, guaranteeing reliable electric power supply.

Evolving Fiber Optic Connectivity: While only four major cities currently feature well-established fiber optic backbone connectivity, the state is actively working to aggressively expand its digital infrastructure.

Strategic Gas Processing Hub: Tabasco hosts three crucial gas processing complexes and a compression center, playing a significant role in Mexico's energy sector.


Southern Border Region Tax Incentives: Companies established in the municipalities of Balancan and Tenosique are eligible for attractive federal tax incentives designed for Mexico's Southern Border Region.

Global Market Presence and Export Value



Sugar Cane & Derivatives:

- Export value USD 17.7 million(A key agro-industrial leader).
- Investment Opportunity: Significant potential in bioethanol and clean energy derived from sugarcane, aligning with global decarbonization objectives.
- Product Development: Development of higher value-added products such as refined sugars, syrups, and natural sweeteners.
- Integration: Focus on integration into global food and beverage supply chains



Cardboard and Cellulose Products

- Export Value: USD \$2.29 million.
- Investment Opportunity: Strategic entry into the circular economy and green packaging, driven by increasing demand from export industries.
- Strategic Alliances: Opportunity to form strategic partnerships with the logistics and agro-industrial sectors to supply certified ecological packaging.
- Nearshoring Advantage: Manufacturing nearshoring in Tabasco offers cost and time reduction compared to Asian imports.



Cacao Beans (Raw or Roasted)

- Export Value: USD \$1.5 million.
- Investment Opportunity: Investment in premium chocolate clusters, leveraging the Cacao Grijalva Denomination of Origin.
- Market Potential: High potential in the gourmet and organic products market (Europe and North America).
- Value Chain Expansion: Development of value chains in cosmetics, nutraceuticals, and functional beverages based on cacao.
- Tourism Opportunity: Opportunities in gastronomic tourism (e.g., Cacao Route, origin experiences).





























